



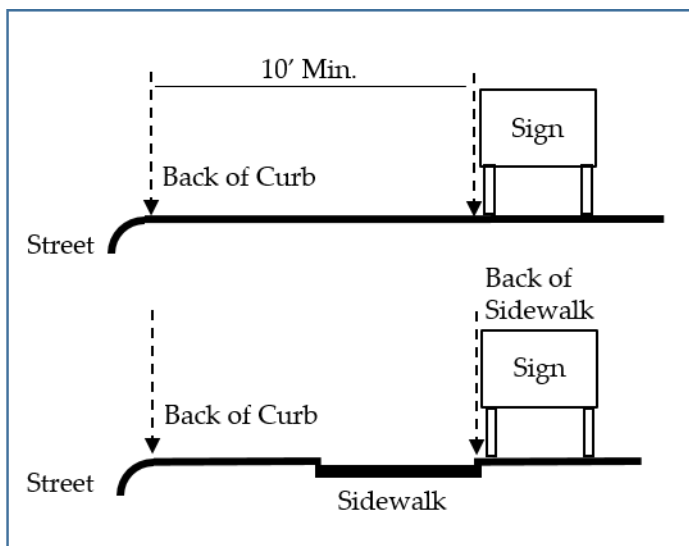
Garage Sale Sign Regulations

- Signs may be a maximum of six square feet in size and may stand a maximum of three feet from the top of the sign to the ground.
- Signs must be set back a minimum of 10 feet from the back of the curb or behind a sidewalk, if one exists, whichever is the greater distance.
- Signs may not be posted more than one day prior to the garage sale and must be removed by 10:00 p.m. on the final day of the event.
- Signs must clearly identify the address, month, and days of the sale.
- Signs may not be located on city, county, state, or school district property.
- Signs may not be placed on utility poles, fences, or trees.
- Individuals placing signs on private property other than the sale premises must first obtain permission from the property owner.
- There may be a maximum of three garage sales at any property within a calendar year.
- Each garage sale may not exceed three consecutive days in length.

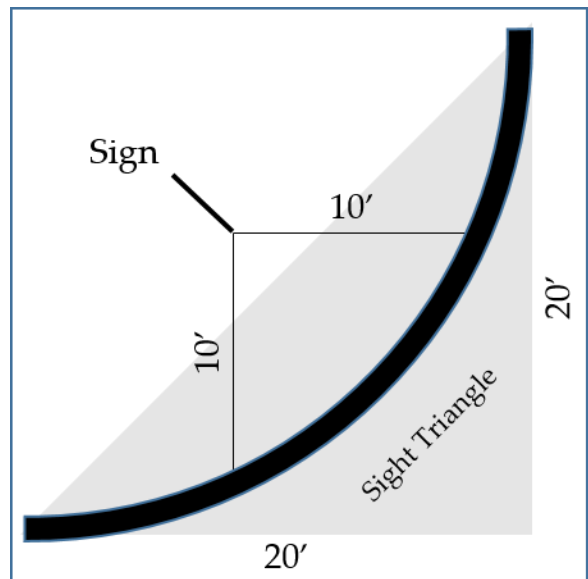
City staff may remove and dispose of any sign placed in violation of city ordinance. Signs that are removed are stored for one week in a shed at the city's public works maintenance facility, 5500 International Parkway, before they are discarded.

Examples:



Garage sale and other temporary signs must be placed 10 feet behind the back of the curb. If a sidewalk is present, signs must be placed behind the sidewalk.



On a corner, signs must be outside the sight triangle, at least 10 feet behind the curb.
